The ACS International Schools Foundation (ACS) is pleased to announce the 2007 ACS International Peace Prize contest for all students aged 14-18*. The Prize will be awarded to the student whose substantial work, in the opinion of the ACS International Peace Prize Committee, promotes understanding of different philosophies and cultures, and instills respect for people, their work, their beliefs, and their expressions.

Applications may include, but are not limited to, documentation of work accomplished on a specific project (community service, peace corps type project, inner city project etc.) or work completed on a topic of relevance to the advancement of peace (essay, art work, video, research paper).

The ACS Peace Prize will consist of £1,000, a medal, and a trip to the award ceremony in England. Additionally, the winner will receive a scholarship to the American University's Washington Semester Program (www.washingtonsemester.com).

ACS International Peace Prize contest deadlines:

1 September 2007	All entries must be received by ACS.
15 September 2007	The winner will be notified.
12 October 2007	The presentations to the winner of the ACS International Peace Prize will take place at ACS Cobham, England.

RULES

- 1 The ACS International Peace Prize ("the Prize") shall be judged by the ACS Peace Prize Committee ("the Committee") which shall comprise such personnel of ACS and other individuals as ACS shall in its absolute discretion select.
- 2 All applications must be received by ACS (at its address below) on or before 1 September 2007.
- 3 Responsibility cannot be accepted by ACS or the Committee for any application or associated work lost, damaged or delayed in the post (or other means of transport and/or communication), or lost or damaged while in the possession of ACS or the Committee. An applicant's associated work is submitted at the Applicant's sole risk and the Applicant should arrange insurance accordingly, if applicable.
- 4 Neither ACS or the Committee shall return works submitted by an Applicant. An Applicant may collect original works from ACS by prior arrangement.
- 5 The Committee shall notify the winner of the award of the Prize by 15 September 2007.
- 6 The decision of the Committee shall be final and the Committee shall not enter into any correspondence or dialogue with any Applicant, school or other third party with regard to the selection of the winner of the Prize.
- 7 The name of the Prize winner shall be available on request.
- 8 The Applicant hereby warrants to ACS and the Committee that:
 - (a) the application and associated work is the Applicant's original work, that it has not been copied wholly or substantially from any other work or material and that the exercise by ACS or the Committee of the rights granted to it by the Applicant will not infringe the rights of any third party;
 - (b) no person created the work other than the Applicant;
 - (c) the Applicant has not granted or assigned any rights of any nature in the works to any third party whatsoever;
 - (d) the work contains nothing that is libelous, defamatory or indecent or which infringes the statutory or other rights of any third party.
- 9 The Applicant hereby grants to ACS and the Committee a non exclusive licence and right to reproduce and/or publish and/or exhibit the work submitted with the application for such purposes as ACS or the Committee shall in its absolute discretion determine including the right to reproduce or publish the work in advertising, publicity or promotional material issued or used in connection with ACS or the Prize.
- 10 The Applicant or the Applicant's school hereby consent to the use of the Applicant's and school's name for publicity purposes and to make themselves available for such marketing or publicity requirements as ACS or the Committee may reasonably require.
- 11 Neither the Applicant or the Applicant's school shall, without the prior written consent of ACS in each instance:
 - (a) use in advertising, publicity, marketing or otherwise the name of ACS or any details regarding the Prize, nor any trade name, trade mark, trade device, service mark, symbol or any abbreviation, contraction or simulation thereof owned by ACS: or
 - (b) represent, directly or indirectly, that any works submitted by the Applicant have been approved or endorsed by ACS.
- 12 The Applicant must, on or before 1 May 2007, be between the ages of 14-18.
- 13 The Prize is established and promoted by ACS.
